Let f be an additive function of the form  $f_n = \sum a_p$ , where the sum is over the prime divisors of n and  $a_2, a_3, a_4, ...$  are real. If this f has an asymptotic distribution function  $\sigma$  then  $\sigma$  is known to be either purely discontinuous or purely singular or absolutely continuous. Conditions for the first case are well known. Examples are given for the other cases. In particular examples for which  $\sigma$  has derivatives of arbitrarily high order, and examples for which  $\sigma$  is represented by the values on the real axis of a transcendental entire function.
