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CHARACTERIZATIONS OF JORDAN DERIVATIONS ON TRIANGULAR RINGS: ADDITIVE MAPS JORDAN DERIVABLE AT IDEMPOTENTS*

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Abstract. Let \mathcal{T} be a triangular ring. An additive map δ from \mathcal{T} into itself is said to be Jordan derivable at an element $Z \in \mathcal{T}$ if $\delta(A)B + A\delta(B) + \delta(B)A + B\delta(A) = \delta(AB + BA)$ for any $A, B \in \mathcal{T}$ with AB + BA = Z. An element $Z \in \mathcal{T}$ is called a Jordan all-derivable point of \mathcal{T} if every additive map Jordan derivable at Z is a Jordan derivation. In this paper, we show that some idempotents in \mathcal{T} are Jordan all-derivable points. As its application, we get the result that for any nest \mathcal{N} in a factor von Neumann algebra \mathcal{R} , every nonzero idempotent element Q satisfying PQ = Q, QP = P for some projection $P \in \mathcal{N}$ is a Jordan all-derivable point of the nest subalgebra Alg \mathcal{N} of \mathcal{R} .
